

Spanish Culture and Civilization through Literature and Visual Arts

Course description

In this course, Spanish culture will be taught through visits to museums and cultural walks in the morning, and meetings in the classroom during the afternoon.

Every day, students will visit a museum or walk around the city with one of the instructors, gaining deep insight into Spanish civilization and culture. As a result of the site visits and discussions, the academic learning of the students will be directly related to their experience of the city.

Class work will focus on analyzing readings, and films by Spanish authors. Films by important Spanish directors such as Luis Buñuel and Pedro Almodóvar will be screened and analyzed, as well as the novels, essays and short stories in which some of these films are inspired. By the end of the course, students will better understand the different periods of the social and cultural history of Spain through a detailed analysis and in-class discussions of some of the most important works of the Spanish culture.

Readings

Since the students will meet in the morning and in the afternoon with the instructors during the two weeks of their stay in Madrid, they will have to do the main part of their readings before arriving in Madrid. This will have the advantage of providing them with a prior knowledge of Spain that will help the students enjoy more of their days in this country.
